Morfix, the popular English-Hebrew dictionary, is now available for iPhone 4

Melingo, the owner of the popular free online English-Hebrew dictionary Morfix, upgraded its dictionary application for iPhone. You can download Morfix for iPhone using the link here.

Morfix application includes a quick, easy access to all popular dictionary contents, including Hebrew and English, playing English words and a link to Wikipedia. If you've inserted a name or term that appears in Wikipedia, Morfix will present a short section article, and links to full articles in English and Hebrew. The application also includes a short phrase translation in Hebrew or English with Google Translate.

An interesting feature included with the product is "Pick a random word" - you can click the icon cube games or shake the unit and Morfix will present a random term and its description. The application can also display the last words that were translated for repeat search.

The current upgrade include full support for iPhone version 4 including multitasking and performance improvement.

So far over 80,000 users downloaded the updated version. Melingo is looking forward to many more iPhone users.
